Dear Friends in Christ, one of the biggest challenges that I have had to deal with since my arrival at Our Lady of the Airways involves the requests concerning memorial masses. Time and

again I am asked why our parish does not offer them. The simple answer is that our parish already celebrates multiple masses every day (e.g., Monday – Friday masses at 8am and 7pm, respectively). These masses do not take into account the other additional masses which we priests regularly celebrate (e.g., school, old age retirement, wedding, funerals, etc.) Although a priest may celebrate multiple masses on any given day, the Church law permits this only when <u>pastoral necessity</u> demands it. Regretfully, memorial masses (though considered a worthy act of charity for our deceased loved one) are not deemed a pastoral necessity.

People often lament how difficult it is to schedule a mass for a particular date for their loved ones. This is true given that <u>the Church only permits one</u> <u>intention per mass</u>. Fortunately, there is a way around this difficulty. The Church permits what it calls "<u>Multi-intention Masses</u>" (MIM). MIM are exceptions to normal practices. In MIM, the mass donors are explicitly informed beforehand that their particular intention will be combined with the intentions of other donors. A <u>maximum of twenty intentions</u> will be offered "collectively" in one single Mass. MIM can be offered for: loved ones who have recently died; funerals that were celebrated at a church other than our parish; memorial mass intentions; anniversary death of a loved one; the sick or the dying; or any other intentions.

Recently, the Chancellor of Spiritual Affairs of our Archdiocese granted our parish the permission to celebrate these MIM masses. *Effective January 2018*, we will be offering three multi-intentional masses each week: two English multi-intentional masses – every Wednesdays (7pm) and Saturdays (8:30am); one Italian multi-intentional mass – every Thursday (7pm). The parish will continue to honor any masses that have already been reserved by parishioners for a single intention, even if those masses fall after January 1, 2018.

It is important to note two additional things: 1) one intention per mass typically means the intention for <u>one person</u>, a married couple, or the members of <u>the same family</u> [e.g., John Smith, Jane & John Smith, the members of the Smith family]. It does not mean, however, mixing multiple, different names [e.g., John Smith, Susan Brown, Peter Turk]); 2) the parish will now be accepting mass intentions <u>only three months in advance</u>. This limitation is intended to give all parishioners an equal opportunity to book masses for their respective intentions. I pray that these MIM will enable you to have your mass intentions fulfilled more easily and in a timely manner.



È vero che ogni Sacerdote può celebrare più Messe ogni giorno, tuttavia il Diritto Canonico permette queste ulteriori celebrazioni solo quando ci sono "necessità pastorali." Le Messe per i Defunti, pur essendo un importante atto di carità verso i nostri defunti, non sono considerate una "necessità pastorale."

Sovente i parrocchiani si sono lamentati di quanto sia difficile ottenere la celebrazione della Messa in un giorno desiderato, poichè il Diritto Canonio permette solamente una intenzione per ciascuna Messa. Fortunatamente, c'è un modo per ovviare a questa difficoltà. La Chiesa permette ciò che viene definita "Messa Multi Intenzionale" (MIM). Le Messe MIM fanno eccezione alle regole usuali. Chi richiede una intenzione che verrà soddisfatta in una celebrazione MIM, sarà antipacitamente avvisato che le proprie particolari intenzioni saranno in congiunzione con altre intenzioni, fino ad un massimo di venti intenzioni "collettivamente" per una singola Messa. Le MIM possono avere intenzioni per persone decedute recentemente, o funerali celebrati in altre Parrocchie, o anniversari di decessi, ammalati, moribondi, o ogni altra occasione.

Recentemente il Cancelliere degli Affari Spirituali della nostra Archidiocesi ha concesso alla nostra Parrocchia il permesso di celebrare MIM ad iniziare da gennaio 1, 2018. Saranno disponibili tre MIM: in inglese ogni mercoledì alle 1900, e il sabato mattina alle 830; e una MIM in italiano ogni giovedì alle 1900. Le Messe già prenotate con singole intenzioni saranno onorate come tali, anche se prenotate da celebrare dopo gennaio 1, 2018.

Ci sono altre due importanti cose: 1) una intenzione per celebrazione usualmente significa: intenzione per una persona, o una coppia sposata, o membri della stessa famiglia (ad esempio, Mario Rossi, o Anna e Mario Rossi, o i membri della familia Rossi, senza tuttavia mischiare nomi di famiglia differenti); 2) La Parrocchia da ora in avanti accetterà intenzioni solo con tre mesi di anticipo. Queste limitazioni hanno lo scopo di offrire ad ognuno la possibilità di prenotare Messe per le rispettive intenzioni. Prego affinchè queste regole per le celebrazioni MIM permettano di soddisfare le richieste di ognuno.
