Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends in Christ, the Church solemnly teaches that the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Sacrifice of the Cross are one and the same sacrifice. Why? Because on Calvary and in the Mass, the Priest and the Victim are one in the same Person; that is, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Having said this, it is important to note that there are a few differences between these two sacrifices: 1) On Calvary, Christ offered a bloody sacrifice by shedding His Blood to the point of death; in the Mass, Christ offers an un-bloody sacrifice, since He cannot experience pain in his body or endure agony because of his Resurrection from the dead; 2) Christ offered only Himself on the Cross; in the Mass, Christ unites His Sacrifice with ours and offers it as one to the Father; 3) On the Cross, those present were able to see Christ's humanity (e.g., His corporal Body); in the Mass, we know that Christ is truly, really, and substantially present with us only through the eyes of faith; 4) On Calvary, Jesus Christ *merited* our salvation, *won* for us the graces we need to be saved, *obtained* for us the blessings of our redemption, and He *earned* heaven for us by His bloody Sacrifice [all these verbs highlight what Christ *did* for us two thousand years ago on Calvary]. In the Mass, Christ *communicates* the blessings of Calvary; He *distributes* the graces won for us; He *makes available* the supernatural light merited by His death; and He *channels* the gifts of salvation for each of us [all these verbs highlight what Christ *does* for us in every Mass].

Why is it that people sometimes say that the "Mass does not do anything for me?" In other words, why does Mass have so little impact or effect on them? The answer is due to the fact that that person has not properly disposed himself/herself to receive the graces from the Mass. Sacramental theology distinguishes between two very important concepts to explain this fact: 1) *ex-opere operato*; 2) *ex-opere operantis*. The first term (translated as: "by the work worked", or "by the work having been done"), means that a sacrament confers grace whenever the sign is validly affected. In other words, the grace from the sacrament is guaranteed by the power and promise of God whenever the sacrament is properly celebrated by the minister, using proper matter and form. Alternatively, one can say that the grace of a sacrament is *never* dependent upon the celebrant or his disposition (e.g., holiness). The second term (translated as: "from the work of the doer"), deals with the disposition of the recipient of the sacrament. Here, the efficacy, or the fruitfulness, of any sacrament is directly proportion to the way a person participates in it. If a person says that "Mass does not do anything for me," it isn't because Jesus has failed to communicate, distribute, make available, or channel blessings, grace, supernatural light, or the gifts of salvation in the Mass; rather, it is because he/she has failed to properly disposed themselves to all these things which Jesus wishes to offer them in every Mass. The failure isn't in Jesus' actions; rather, the failure is in their actions and the fault is theirs alone. Let us take the time to prepare ourselves so that we might more worthily participate in the Holy Mass, and in so doing greatly benefit from the Sacrifice which Jesus offered on Calvary two thousand years ago. Thank You For Your Generosity



In today's Gospel Reading from St. Mark, it is reported that Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach, but His teaching was somewhat different from that normally heard there "for he taught with authority and not as the scribes." Often those who taught in Jesus' time (the scribes) simply quoted others, a variety of Rabbis.

However, Jesus taught with authority because He had authority. Jesus' divine message was not quoting other humans, but quoting God. Jesus was One with God so He knew what He was talking about. Jesus taught with authority because He believed what He was teaching. He was familiar with the information which allowed Him to teach boldly. People listening could perceive that this was someone Who knew.

Up until this time we have seen the Lord as the Son of Man Who submitted to His Father. He submitted to God in His Baptism, and to the Holy Spirit in the wilderness. To have authority also requires submission. We, too, are called to submit to God, but for us that is sometimes challenging because it requires humility, something that is not easy for many of us.

Later in the Gospel of John there is another account of the Lord teaching at the Temple. He is challenged, and His response is quite simply, "My teaching is not from myself; it comes from the one who sent me." We are not divine, but we, too, are sent.

Vive nel regno di Dio chi, nella libertà dell'amore, si sottomette all'azione potente del suo Spirito che "è Signore e dà la vita". Adamo ed Eva con il peccato si sono ribellati a Dio sottraendosi alla sua sovranità, ed a causa loro tutti gli uomini sono stati costituiti peccatori (Rm 5,12) per cui "giacciono sotto il potere del Maligno" (1Gv 5,15), il quale regna sull'uomo con la forza della menzogna e con la legge del peccato.

Gesù Cristo, nuovo Adamo, sottomesso al Padre con una obbedienza spinta fino alla morte di croce (Fil 2,8), ripieno di Spirito Santo e rivestito di potenza dall'alto al battesimo del Giordano, inizia la sua missione instaurando il regno di Dio con autorità. I demoni si sottomettono a lui, manifestando così che il loro potere sull'uomo ormai volge al termine e che il regno di Dio è entrato nel mondo. La parola di Gesù, al contrario di quella degli altri maestri del tempo, non tende a diffondere delle opinioni dottrinali, chiama invece gli uomini all'obbedienza a lui (1Pt 1,2) per mezzo della fede(cf. Rm 1,5; 6,16-17), la pratica dei suoi comandamenti(Gv 14,21) e la guida del suo Santo Spirito. Oggi è compito della Chiesa, cioè di ogni cristiano, far arrivare il regno di Dio ad ogni uomo su questa terra.
